NEW BOOK DISPLAY INCORPORATES QR CODES

You've got to come in and check out the latest book display in the LMC!

Movies have trailers or previews so that you'll get hooked and just have to go see them, right? Did you know that books have book trailers too?

Through the use of QR codes, the newest LMC book display incorporates YouTube videos that show a summary of the book's story—just like a movie trailer.

QR codes are those funny looking squares that say, "scan here for more information." To take advantage of our QR codes, you simply need to have a QR code reader app on your smart phone. Mrs. Z uses the free app, *Qr Barcode Scanner*, on her android.

The process is as simple as taking a


picture with your phone. Once in the app, you hold your phone over the QR code of the book trailer you want to watch, and it automatically prompts you to open the corresponding YouTube video.

Some of the videos are made by the publisher of the books, while others are student projects produced by high schoolers all over the United States.

Don't have a QR Scanner? That's ok too. Each of the available book trailers also has the web address of the video listed so you can log onto one of the LMC computers to access it.

Come in and check it out. Who knows, maybe you'll be inspired to make your own book trailer to have on display here in the LMC!

WHERE DID THAT COME FROM ANYWAY?



Captain Eber Brock Ward
1811-1875

Have you ever noticed the HUGE antique bookshelf in our LMC? Measuring 11 feet across and over 10 feet tall, this behemoth commands attention!

The bookcase is the original from Captain Eber Ward's home in Detroit.

Captain Eber Ward was an American iron and steel manufacturer and shipbuilder. He was known as the "steamship king of the Great Lakes" and as the "first of the iron kings."

Ward became Detroit's first millionaire. He was the wealthiest man in the Midwest in his time, due to his steel factories.

In 1853, he founded the Eureka Iron Company located on what is currently Biddle. The following year he platted the Village of Wyandotte. He reserved the waterfront for his iron manufacturing facilities and his other companies, silver smelting, and shipbuilding.

Captain Eber Ward added a new industry to Wyandotte's riverfront in 1871. Shipyards were built south of Eureka along the river's edge. Over the next fifty years more than 200 hulls would be launched from the Wyandotte works.

Now filled with old library books and Wy-Hi Yearbooks from our archives, come in and take a look at this piece of Wyandotte and Detroit history right here in our very own library.


MRS. Z WANTS TO KNOW...
